Instructions for scoring our Dental Anxiety Scale:-

Each item is scored as follows:

Not anxious	1
Slightly anxious	2
Fairly anxious	3
Very anxious	4
Extremely anxious	5

Total score is the sum of all six items, range from 5 to 30: A score of 23 or above indicates a highly dentally anxious patient, possibly dentally phobic.
